Speaker

This week's speaker was Kurt T. Steinberg, Ed.D., Chief Operating Officer of the Peabody Essex Museum.

The Peabody Essex Museum in Salem, traces

its roots to the 1799 founding of the East India Marine Society. This society, composed of Salem ship captains and supercargoes who sailed to distant lands, included a provision in its bylaws for creating a "cabinet of natural and artificial curiosities," essentially a museum. This initial collection formed the basis of the museum that eventually evolved into the Peabody Essex Museum. Today it boasts 24 structures and gardens as part of its collection.

Kurt enlightened us and challenged us to see a story in every exhibition at the PEM. From 1799 to the present a storied history is told. Each exhibit shows the viewer a time, a place, people, and their contributions. The PEM values engaging the visitors in the difficult and complex topics that have shaped our history citing Imperialism, slavery, and injustices. The PEM houses permanent, visiting, and special exhibits that teach, inspire, and motivate. The PEM's strategic plan aims to be impactful locally, globally and virtually.
