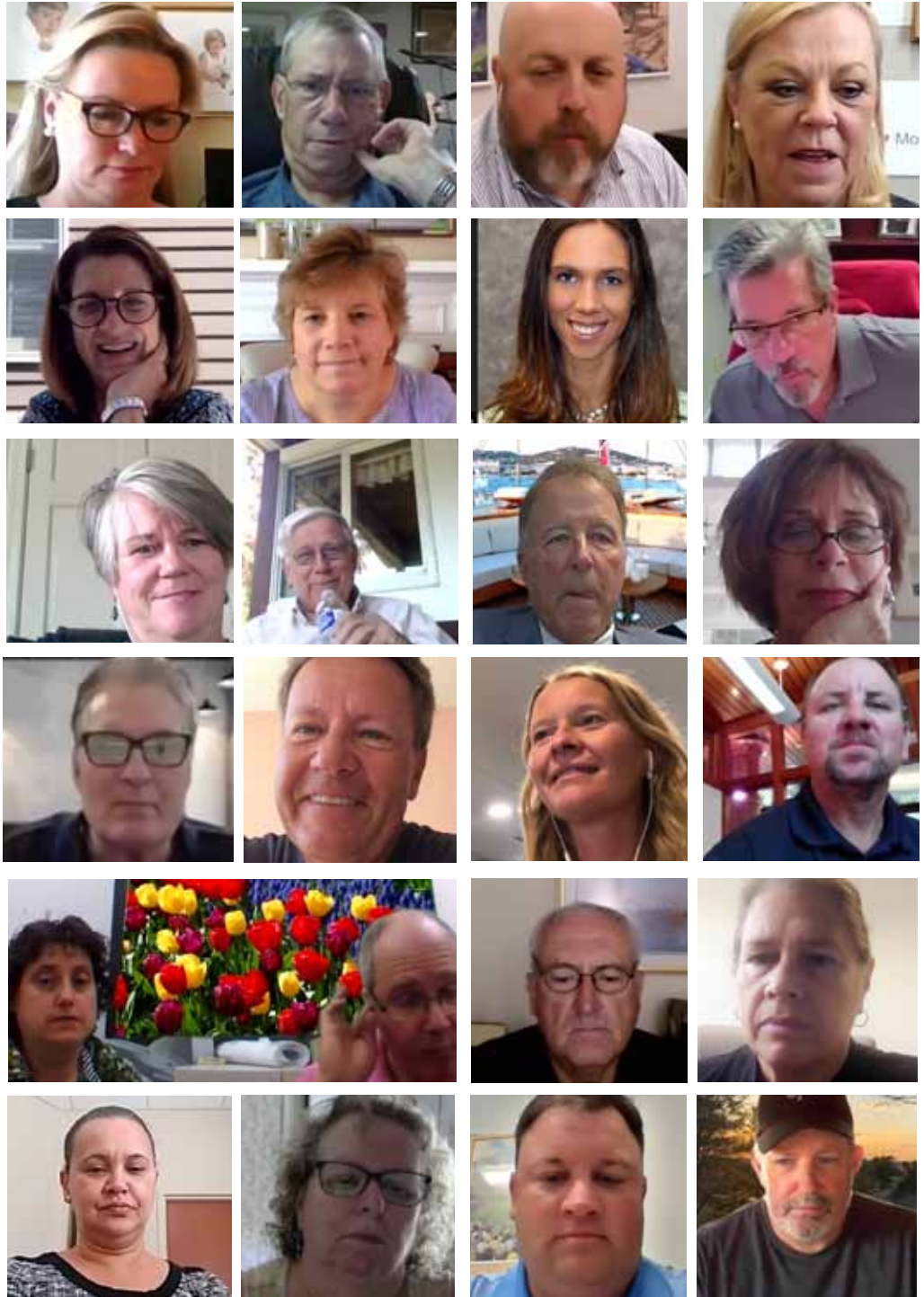

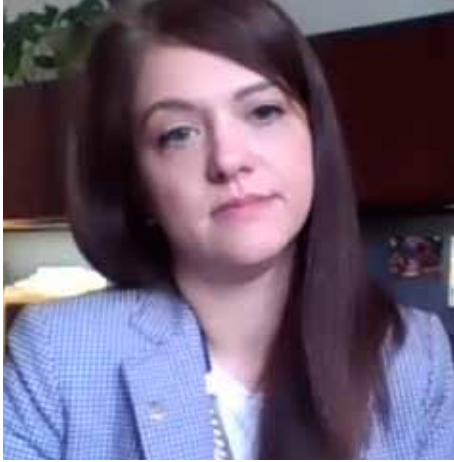

Hey random Rotary assorted do-gooders,

How does a work project where social distancing is measured in ACRES sound?

On **SATURDAY 10/10 from 1:00 - 4:00 PM** we are working with
Boston Area Gleaners (bostonareagleaners.org)
to harvest produce for local food banks.

"Say Bob, what is gleaning?"

Well, I'm glad you asked. Gleaning is a traditional practice - it's mentioned in the Bible! - in which farm owners invite neighbors to harvest excess crops that would otherwise spoil.

Boston Area Gleaners is a well-established, highly efficient organization that coordinates volunteers and delivers to a network of food banks. Our own **BEVERLY BOOTSTRAPS** is a long time recipient of **BAG** produce and Sue Gabriel tells me **BAG** is a top notch outfit.

So are you interested?

Fresh air, light exercise, do-gooding in a COVID-safe environment? Not to mention, take on food insecurity, which has been aggravated by the pandemic?

Then sign up - I need a head count **ASAP**. Feel free to invite spouses, partners, high school flames who have reappeared in your life (ahem), and children (13 and over please). Next week, when we know where we are assigned, I will ask you to confirm.

In the best of possible worlds, we would work at a local farm (Wenham, Ipswich, Danvers, maybe) and allocate our harvest for **BOOTSTRAPS**. At this point, that's not certain. There are many factors beyond our control - we're dealing with farms and harvests and dozens of food banks with shifting needs. So I see this as a test run.

Sue says don't push the BOOTSTRAPS donation - any assistance to BAG is assistance to BOOTSTRAPS.

If we find out that our destination farm is a little beyond your reach, understood, just decline the invitation. But if you're itching to ditch the zoom screen, put on a pair of pants (elastic waists totally fine), get outside, and get some exercise, (not to mention benefit those food banks!), let me hear from you!
