## Last weeks news, Thursday Jan 28. 21

Meeting started at 12:15

Pledge - Walt

#### Speaker

MAYOR UPDATE - Started by thanking all the people who make things happen in the City Gov't and the Schools.

COVID Update - went from closing down everything and learning how to combat COVID, to plan on how to help people make it through economically. Then went onto planning how to open things up. Some sectors of the local economy have been fine and figuring out how to meet the need. For other sectors it's been incredibly difficult to keep things going. The City has spent a lot of time planning how to reopen everything safely.

The Summer Learning Program - questionable on whether it could continue to be delivered. We were able to pull it off, but just the morning part. 180 kids to 60 kids this past summer. The kids were so eager to be there in person. It was difficult to see how many kids were not having their needs being met in a virtual setting. This was useful to help the City realize how important it was to figure out how to get kids back in school, in person in the Fall. There were many connections between many Cities

and Towns and with the Governor.

Then it became an issue of how to get testing and contact tracing. The City has been working with the State on trying to build a better infrastructure for

distributing the vaccine.

There were concerns and fears about the local budgets, but Federal and State budgets have been able to make room to address needs for schools, etc. Regular City work continues - well into the reconstruction of Henry's Market intersections. Lots of other projects underway.

There are lots of things going on in the City - regarding the Master Plan!

Deep into the details of the Bass River Overlay. Q&A from Mayor

- What will we do with the old police station?
- Plan is that when we are able to take on the debt service for that, we will renovate that to become available for municipal offices. Lots of City Departments are spread out throughout the City, so it will be good to get them all back in the same area.
- Trying to build a net zero building into the police station.
- What about the space at the GAR and Senior Center?
- Senior Center will continue to be used by the Senior Center.
- GAR Hall will be used by the general public for meetings and gathering space.
- Is there a possibility with the elementary schools, that a full day education will begin in March/April?

- School district has been working on responding to

requirements for more face-to-face meetings - rather than kids working by themselves.

- If Vaccine is done right, and the strains don't change too much, then we are hoping to normal back to school by the Fall.
- How to help older people get vaccinated?
- Every day we are talking to the state and health department and trying to set up more sites. The state isn't ready because there aren't enough vaccines, but hopefully they will be ready to go once more vaccines are available.
- Beverly Hospital will be opening a clinic in Beverly next week.
- The goal is that any one person will have multiple options of where to go.
- There may be a lottery system as well.
- What are the recommendations around COVID, etc.? Have they changed?
- Spikes in hospitalizations, but now they've decreased. The Governor has definitely stepped back a bit as well. We did not take any steps beyond what the state has done.
- Keep listening and making the best decisions for you and your circle.
