Speakers:

Dr Doug Peterson

spoke about his experiences with COVID down in NYC during the early months of the NYC hot spot. He was assigned to report 4 days after he was called to a hospital in Brooklyn after reporting to Fort Dix, NJ. His team had poor success initially trying every possible treatment of COVID. Some of those with various illnesses there was nothing they could do except comfort the family. Many new nursing graduates had a first hand experience with dying patients. He was able to get out into NYC and see nearly empty Times Square and Central park. In scrubs they were applauded by New Yorkers as they walked about their business. His

team after their mission was completely COVID free and no symptoms which speaks a great deal of the precautionary methods they used on the front lines. He took a few questions about his experience and gratefully received thanks from many members of club.

Dr Kurt Steinberg, Montserrat College of Art


Kurt spoke on the work that the school did over the summer to prepare incoming students with the tools and information on how to be safe. This includes staying in smaller pods of students and respecting the people of Beverly by wearing mask at all times when out and about. So far numerous testing has been done with nary positive cases. At this point the school is doing a variety of methods from in class to zoom to teach their students. Any misconduct is treated quickly to minimize student and teacher exposure

Dr Steven DiSalvo Endicott College

Steven spoke on the larger Endicott school and its efforts to be viable during COVID. There students have taken over 7000 Covid test and a very small percentage is positive. Those are guarantined from other population. Like Montserrat strict guidelines are in place to ensure safety for students and faculty alike. Misconduct is treated swiftly and they also have a guarantine area for positive results. 99% of students are adhering to school policies. A very few have been dismissed for not following protocol. Many new rules and policies are in effect, but the school is trying its best to maintain a "normal" school year for its 3000+ students, most of whom live on campus. Interesting fact, Dr DiSalvo, a New York native was contacted by Mayor DiBlasio if the hockey rink was still up and running earlier in the year. This was an option for a possible temp morgue for NYC which was running out of space for the 30K + who died in a few short months. Makes you think, yep this is real.


