Joan spoke in particular about the Annual Fund, and how that money is used. 50% of the money donated to the AF goes to World Funds, and 50% is directed towards District Designated (or local) Funds. Last year, a total of \$58,323 supported 27 grants over 17 clubs in the district. A service dog was given to disabled Marine vet Mikala Britto.
