

Speaker:

Mike Jones (President) introduced his brother Billy Jones, a Beverly fire Fighter, EMT, EMS educator; saying that after the recent incident of Damar Hamlin receiving CPR twice in an NFL game, he was inspired to invite Billy to refresh our minds on the proper techniques of CPR. Billy Jones introduced himself as a Mike's Favorite Brother and Rich's favorite son! A Beverly Firefighter, a Mc-Neilly EMS CPR Instructor He wants to give an overview of CPR and reminded the Club of a Lunch and Learn coming up at GBCC on February 15th. Billy named some limitations to attempting CPR on a person presenting with cardiac arrest, which include, age, medical conditions etc. He countered the myth that performing CPR could get one sued, saying that the good Samaritan Law protects anyone who performs CPR during and for a lifesaving emergency. The Idea of performing CPR could be likened to the act of pumping water from say a flooded basement and while doing the compressions, there comes a point when a cadence to the rhythm is felt and one is tempted to sing a tune that rhymes with the routine. Keeping the chest compression at about 100 to 120 compressions per minute. Billy also pointed out that the very first thing to consider when we are faced with a situation that warrants CPR for someone who is presenting with cardiac arrest is to check for alertness; followed by not getting into a panic and delegating to call 911 to a specific person, and another to get the Automated External Defibrillator (AED or DEFIB). While performing CPR one should utilize the division of labor to decrease fatigue, giving 2inch deep and straight compressions. Billy said that he has a motivational goal to get every student in the Beverly public school system trained in CPR. Then he asked the club to guess the city with the best witness cardiac survival rates amongst, Boston Miami and Seattle. He said it was Seattle due to the prevalence of larger tech companies offering CPR as part of their workforce training. Walt K. asked Billy for a clarification about where to place a hand for compression to which he responded by demonstrating with a mannequin, stress to position the hand slightly lower

to a question about mouth-to-mouth resuscitation, saying that during CPR the subject absorbs 21 % from the air while the mouth-to-mouth only delivers much less than 15%, hence it has been determined irrelevant. Billy said that proper CPR is achieved while doing the compression on a flat surface. Walt K. asked whether the Athlete who had a cardiac episode a few weeks ago had CPR administered on the field. Billy explained the technicality of doing CPR while transporting a person in an ambulance, highlighting that during Transportation, it's a little more difficult since the mobility of the ambulance is a limiting factor s well. In some cases a "lucas" device is deployed to continue the chest compressions mechanically. Billy said that the best position for a person for CPR is the 'Manchester' sniff position, where the nose is pointing upwards. Billy likened CPR to professional sports: "You do not stop until the whistle goes" On infant CPR, Billy demonstrated the proper infant CPR technique with a smaller mannequin. The quicker CPR is started on a person the more likely the rescue. Billy finally answered a question of what the average response time for Ambulance arrival in emergency situations, considering all other odds: 7 Minutes!



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
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
