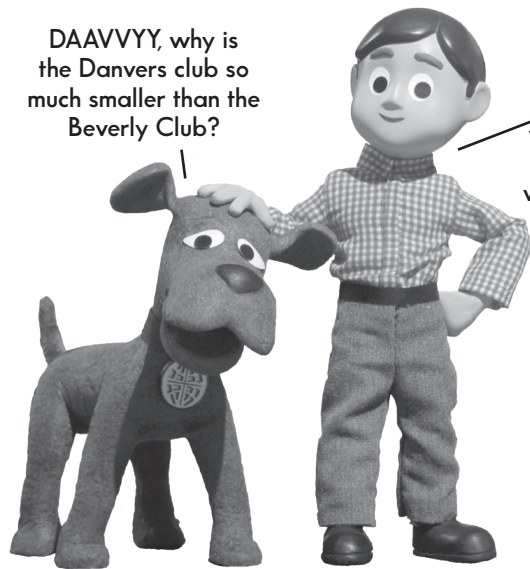

Northeast Arc has a \$250 million dollar budget with over 60 locations and 80 vehicles. They are actively working and partnering with other major competitors like Bridgewell to help conserve costs - like sharing an IT support center.

She was proud of a recent opportunity provided by a benefactor that gave

\$1MM to what they refer to as the "Arc Tank". The idea was to gather as many as 100 proposals former around the best way to help the community. Those proposals were slimmed down to seven with the top three being:
YMCA - Water wise Program. The YMCA identified that the number one killer for children with Autism is drowning. They made it their new program to help train Autistic children how to address and prevent those occurrences.
Disrupting Guardianship -For situations where guardianship isn't needed but it is being forced on someone.
Gap Year for Medical Professionals - this was plan to take medical professionals and dental professionals and give them a gap year while seeing the issues that we have for people with disabilities.

One of the questions that came up was getting housing for people with disabilities, and the real problem isn't creating the housing, it's getting the personal to help manage them. Now Northeast Arc is looking into ways to address this using technology to help manage people and to have people live together for an improvement in quality of life.

Raffle Winner: Brian Murphy held the winning ticket and as expected - pulled the nine of clubs.

Meeting Adjourned: Matt adjourned the meeting around 1:30pm.
