Lisa Sobian is a Licensed Independent Clinical Social Worker and Certified Dementia Practioner. She has been the Director of Dementia Services at D'Youville Life and Wellness Community in Lowell for the past 11 years. She has been a volunteer with the Alzheimer's Association for 10 years.

Carey Ann Gallini is a research scientist with the Harvard School of Public Health. Her interest in neurology, Alzheimer's awareness and advocacy was sparked by her mother's diagnosis in 2015.

Carey Ann spoke about her own experience with the Alzheimer's Association and all of the support and educational information they can provide. 
