

#### Speaker

Maximilian Panda was our speaker, and the youngest one we have ever had! He is 13 years old at Beverly Middle School, and he is striving for a better society by working with an organization called Sukarya USA. He serves as a youth ambassador for this NGO, which has been around for about 20 years, and the name means "good work". Sukarya works with women and children in the slums of India, and they have several pillars of their work. They raise awareness and mobilize resources for children living in the Indian slums and remote villages. They empower rural women by providing healthcare for moms and children living there and in the slums. They the empower children to lead healthier lives and have converted buses into mobile schools. They send healthcare providers to educate about hygiene and health. It is \$25 to educate one child for one month and \$1200 to educate 4 children for a year. Maximillian has collected donations and every cent counts, including a lemonade stand that raised \$300. He has contacted businesses and service organizations and is organizing a basketball tournament called "Slumdunk". He also plans to hold a charity summer party, and he is traveling to India next summer with his family to volunteer and give lessons on the busses. The Club voted to donate all funds collected today to contribute towards Max's fundraising goal.

# The Swierczynski Swizzle Schtick

If you're like me, and I know you are, these beautiful autumn days and the re-awakening of our Red Sox, remind me of a certain larger-than-life chief justice with Beverly and baseball ties. President William Howard Taft (1909-1913), was the first President to toss the ceremonial first pitch at opening day for a major league game. As Chief Justice of the Supreme Court (1921-1930), Taft presided over the Federal Baseball oral arguments, the original baseball anti-trust exemption case. And in between those two Federal stints, Taft was considered for the position of Major League Baseball Commissioner, an offer he could refuse perhaps because it might have conflicted with his brother Charlie Taft's financial interest in the Chicago Cubs. Which implies that Beverly's most noteworthy, if not largest, summer resident was a true baseball fan. The Montgomery Advisor (3/3/1913) begs to differ. This pro-Wilson chronicle describes Taft's baseball attendance as purely ceremonial and experienced with as much joy as "a mortician at a christening... [Taft at the ball park] always had the appearance that he would lots rather be in a juxtaposition to a big steak with all the trimmings, with a napkin tucked under his chin." Speaking of gusto, I'd lots rather recommend that we juxtapose to a drink called A Double Taft Draft, a stout concoction best consumed, if not prepared, in an oversized bathtub: pour 2 oz bourbon and 2 oz coffee liqueur into a highball or tulip glass (or milk bucket if handy); slowly pour 12 oz chilled stout into the container; consume with napkin tucked under chin. Play ball!
