

Speaker: Dean Berg of Green Beverly-"Build a Sustainable Bev Together"

Had worked in the software industry and then shifted his focus on teaching others how to live a more sustainable lifestyle.

Green Beverly is a nonprofit on a mission: to help all Beverly residents and businesses lead more sustainable lives through actionable information, inspiration, and education. Sustainability: anything that we as residents or businesses have control over.

Actionable: we must prompt and inspire action. If we don't do this then we have failed on our mission.

Why? Beverly has set the bar for climate action - we've worked on the Beverly and Salem Resilient Together Climate Action plan.

We control about 65-85% of our greenhouse gas emissions footprint.

There are so many questions! When we buy clothes, we have many options to help! Do we buy from a store, do we buy online, do we buy thrifted? Green Beverly is here to help answer these questions.

Where do I start? Resilient Together has set the bar.

It will take the residents, the school system, AND the City.

There are community wide solutions and individual solutions.

Community wide is a response to systemic issues, things that require all the stakeholders involved. This can include local food production. Food that we buy out of state is 10x worse for the GHG. We should be producing more food locally. Increasing local food production! We are working with

Tufts research students.

We heat our homes with oil or gas - if we can migrate these systems to electric, then this will reduce greenhouse gas emissions. It can be a very expensive process. We are looking for creative solutions to help homeowners make this decision. Ideally with financing to help the homemakers make the shift without incremental cost.

Can we figure out how to take leftover food in the restaurants to give to those who are food insecure?

We try to meet people where they are at:

Digital: greenBeverly.org. We wanted it to be very Beverly specific and highlight local Beverly businesses. It has a database of green actions - cheap and free things people can do every day.

Physical: we have a three year lease on a space in the Cummings Center (107Q). Sustainability showcase - everything is up cycled or recycled. We want it to be a net zero kind of display.

Coaching: impartial experts help answer questions and provide one on one guidance. They are your neighbors! They aren't representing a product or a service.

In the Community: we are trying to be at events and visible in the community as much as possible. We are also doing educational workshops (such as an outdoor composting workshop we held at the Library or the Pumpkin Smash). 650 pumpkins and over 450 people at the Pumpkin Smash! "Let's keep our pumpkins (90% water) out of the waste stream!"

Closing: It's been terrific to work with Green Beverly over the past 3 months. I'm impressed with the passion, the energy and the dedication to climate action. It gives me HOPE." -Ella, college intern. Our goal is to give the next generation hope!
